Letter From the President

"Greetings,

We have some wonderful exhibits coming up this spring, including the Artwork of Janet Nelson in March, the Annual Whitewater Unified School District Art Exhibit in April, and Art From My Heart by Karolyn Alexander in May. Look for more information about these exhibits in our newsletter – and come visit the exhibits when you can!

March is a month where we talk about the impact that Arts have on communities everywhere. We know that communities thrive and grow when they have access to the Arts; studies show that local investment in the creative economy attracts business, residents and visitors and improves quality of life for everyone.

Did you know these three facts, taken from national research done by Americans for the Arts, the National Endowment for the Arts and the U.S. Department of Commerce's Bureau of Economic Analysis?

- •Wisconsin's nonprofit arts and cultural sector is a \$535 million industry, resulting in nearly \$65 million in local and state tax revenues, 22,872 in full-time equivalent jobs and \$479 million in resident income (source: Americans for the Arts and Wisconsin Arts Board).
- •According to Dun & Bradstreet, Wisconsin's creative sector encompasses over 12,000 businesses and employs nearly 50,000 people in full-time jobs mostly with small, entrepreneurial companies.
- •In 2017 the arts & cultural sector contributed \$760 billion (4.2 %) to the U.S. economy.

This information doesn't even count the impact that the Arts have on students' learning and civic engagement (I'll share those facts another time!). These facts, and a desire to make sure that Whitewater schools and community have access to Art in all its forms, are what motivate the Whitewater Arts Alliance volunteers and board to manage shows and concerts, serve as docents, make cookies for receptions, and spend time on strategic planning for the organization. We would love to have your help if you are interested in volunteering or serving on the board.

One of these events, that will be part of the School district Art Exhibit in April, is an "Inclusive Excellence in the Arts" dance performance on April 6 at 2 p.m. in the Cultural Art Center. Two Inclusive Excellence Scholars who are working with UW-W's College of Arts and Communication will do a dance concert and panel discussion, discussing their creative process and inspiration behind their work. Dr. Alessandra Williams has conducted research and taught classes in Asian American and African American dance, as well as performed nationally and internationally with the Minneapolis-based Ananya Dance Theatre company. Alfonso Cervera is the co-artistic director of Primera Generacion Dance Collective and has performed internationally and nationally with works that convey ideas on the Mexican-American experience. Cervera also utilizes his own technique "Poc-Chuc" that fuses Ballet Folklorico and Post-Modern techniques and aesthetics.

Photography Workshop May 4—FREE!

2019 Whitewater Arts Alliance Photography Fundamentals Hands-On Workshop

Saturday, May 4, 2019 from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

Cultural Arts Center Gallery 402 W Main Street Whitewater, WI 53190

Learn and practice the fundamentals of photography at this free, four-hour hands-on workshop sponsored by the Whitewater Arts Alliance. Join Jeff McDonald and Everett Long as they present, demonstrate, and mentor the class through hands-on practice exercises.

The workshop is free, open to

the public, and all are welcome to attend. However, in order that the WAA may better plan the workshop, those planning to attend are asked to please RSVP to jeff.mcdonald@gaelicarts.com

Topics covered will include: camera basics such as camera controls, getting sharp images, and changing lenses; digital photography basics such as getting proper exposure, automatic and manual exposure modes, auto-focus and manual focus, shutter speed, aperture, ISO, and white balance; and artistic considerations such as composition, light and shadow, depth of field, and capturing motion. Several stations with varving photographic subjects will be arranged for participants' practice exercises.

Participants are asked to bring their camera with its user manual, charged battery, and memory card. The camera should have a manual exposure mode (where shutter speed, aperture, and ISO may be set manually) and use interchangeable lenses. Users of other types of cameras are welcome to participate but the workshop is designed for the cameras described. At least one tripod will be provided for the class to share but participants may want to bring their own tripod if they have one.

"Everett and I have conducted several Whitewater Arts Alliance photography programs over the last few

years and we appreciate the positive response and feedback. The most-requested suggestion from attendees of those programs has been for us to include a hands-on component where participants bring their own cameras

and get first-hand guidance on their use. The new four-hour format will allow us the time for this to be practical," said Jeff McDonald.

For award-winning photographer Everett Long, photography became an avocation and a passion after retiring from a 31-year career teaching history at UW-Whitewater.



Said Long, "I've always had cameras, using them primarily to record family events and travels. My principle subject matter since becoming serious about photography are what generally could be defined as nature photography, including landscapes, flowers (both representational and abstract), birds, water scenes, fall colors, as well as sunrises and sunsets, etc. A tripod is necessary for obtaining the close-up photos of flowers and other small objects

in nature which I favor. Adobe
Lightroom
permits me to organize,
store,
and edit the thousands of digital photos that I have taken over the years."

Jeff McDonald's photography has been recognized with awards at international photography exhibitions in

the United States, Australia, Canada,

Europe, and Asia. His photographic interests include black and white, long exposure, landscape, architecture, street, and stilllife

photography.

"My objective as a fine art photographer is to produce remarkable images. Motion, unusual visual perspectives, and interesting light intrigue me, as do the found elements of a scene that challenge one to frame them into an interesting composition. In my view, fine art photography is far more about presenting the artist's interpretation of reality than it is about presenting objective reality, as it would be for a

photojournalist. To that end, I embrace the tools of the digital

darkroom, the modern analogue of the chemical darkroom, applying them as little as possible but

as much as necessary when they help me achieve my artistic vision," said McDonald.

McDonald is a Whitewater Arts Alliance board member and has served as



Thanks to artists and art lovers alike -who participated in last year's "Making Magic with Mixed Media" show, (photos from 2018) there were 140 pieces of 2D and 3D art from over 45 local and area artists.

Show organizers hope that this year's offering will be greeted with an equally enthusiastic response from artists in the region, and from friends, families, and the

general public who will want to attend and show their support.

Mixed Media has become an umbrella term for 2D and 3D visual art that has been created and produced by artists from all over the country and the world.

The magic is in the challenge of combining more than one medium (i.e., acrylic, oil, watercolor, pastel, charcoal, pen, pencil, etc.) and/or more than one material (i.e., cut up paper, wire, beads, found objects, etc.) in one piece of art. Some may debate that mixed media might also include using more than one technique in the creative process.



Featured Artist — Nancy McKinnon

"In The Beginning"

It was in 1998 when I experienced my first watercolor workshop in Maui. A tropical island, sunshine, and beautiful flowers had all the components to put myself into a zone...the perfect location to begin my new love for "doing art."



It was also during this time when I first met watercolor artist and instructor Barbara Mathews in Janesville. In addition to being one of her students, I also was the travel organizer for the "Come Paint With Me" art tours that Barbara has lead for two decades. Her passion for painting and her love of travel was a winning combination. She was instrumental in attracting students of all levels to follow her to new and exciting destinations, such as tours to the Caribbean, Mexico, Canada, Greek Isles, Hawaii, Italy, Ireland, Sedona, Santa Fe, and Alaska. Traveling the world opened my eyes to the richness of different cultures and landscapes. It was during these years that I realized art needed to be a major part of my life.

My favorite style in watercolor is when I paint very loose abstract backgrounds, and the subject matter is very



realistic. These pieces reflect my current watercolor subject which are flowers and trees. I also love experimenting with different additives and mediums to see what would happen if I just add this or that! The spontaneity of art is important to me, and it was during this process that I decided to find some "kid friendly" projects in art.

Grandchildren needed to



become part of my art world, so I started searching projects that would be suitable and safe. It was during this time that I came across acrylic pourings and alcohol ink projects. Online opportunities were many! A set of poured coasters were made at Ravens Wish in Janesville for a kid's class, and that was another beginning.

This led to my current love of fluid acrylic art pourings. For the last two years I now realize that this process is the most fun for kids and adults! Layering paints in a cup and watching it explode into a piece of art is both exciting and amazing!

I recently started painting on some of these pieces, and realized it can be another extension of this type of art. Abstract background with a realistic subject matter, and it seems that I have come full circle infusing my watercolors and acrylic pourings.

In our community I have been involved with the Janesville Art League by promoting and exhibiting the membership's art at various venues, such as Marling Homeworks, Janesville Performing Art Center, the Janesville Innovation Center, and the Janesville Country Club. I have done art workshops for children and adults in Janesville, Beloit, and Clinton. Last summer I exhibited at the WAA Mixed Media Show and became a member of this art organization. This summer I will be participating in this event by doing a workshop titled "Pour and More."

During 2018 I was the artist selected to do art therapy workshops at Gift's Men Shelter in Janesville. It is a very rewarding opportunity to help make a difference when I see their art proudly displayed in the shelter's hallways, lobby, and board room.

I was the featured artist at Creekside Place in Evansville in January, and it was my first solo show. My work can also be seen at Sievers, a nationally recognized School Of Fiber Arts on Washington Island in Door County.

I am currently on the Board of Directors for the Wisconsin Regional Art Association (WRAA). I am the appointed chairperson for Bridging Generations, a youth program for children ages 5-12 years old. Our mission is to educate, instruct, and have fun doing art. In November 2019 we will do another workshop and art exhibit at Basics Cooperative in Janesville.

I have also exhibited at many Wisconsin Regional Art Programs in Wisconsin. My state awards have been in watercolor, photography and acrylics. My first state award "Leave Me Alone"



has a fond memory for me because it was in Whitewater! In 2018 I received a state and conference award on "Within The Deep," from Whitewater again!

"Beyond My Imagination" is my newest acrylic piece of art, that has become one of my favorite styles of painting. It is done with the colors of the rainbow on canvas and it is an expression of my feelings for a series of pieces that I will call "Beginnings."

After 48 years as a travel agent, I am currently now retired, and find that I am "doing art" every day. I am often asked if I will share my art




techniques. I am happy to say that it flatters me to hear these comments.

My philosophy on art is quite simple: **To Each One-Teach One**. If I can share my knowledge and techniques, then I hope each recipient will pass it on to another.


